## JOURNEY PRESENTATION RUBRIC

You will be sharing your journey to the class by presenting it along with a poster that represents your journey. You will have 3-5 minutes to present your poster and journey to the class in which you will explain all the steps of your journey and what you were able to learn and why or how.

Your poster should include:

1. Your lesson learned is clearly printed on the poster.
2. Your self-discovery question is clearly printed on the poster.
3. Pictures, drawings, magazine cutouts, and whatever else will help represent your journey and all of the steps it took to get to that meaningful place. Be creative! (**Note:** All items must be school appropriate.)
4. Save poster and submit (Google Slide should be submitted via Google Classroom.)
