 Take notes AS YOU READ. Use sticky notes to summarize each chapter or keep a running log for each chapter on paper. Finish reading early. The faster, the better. Do not spend majority of your time on summary. It should be one of the easier sections. Bring in draft(s)! 	 Research early. It does you no good to find out after you read the book that there is no information. Use both reliable sources and a variety of sources. Do not just "cut and paste" information! Cite sources (both parenthetical citations and Works Cited!!!) Bring in draft(s)! 	 Identify literary techniques as you read! Use sticky notes to mark them along the way. Give thorough explanations/justifications. Cite sources (both parenthetical citations and Works Cited!!!) Bring in draft(s)!
